




May, 2020 BC's Restart Plan begins


December, 2020 BC Proof of Vaccination Card Program begins









Capital funding to increase the number of intensive care and high acuity units

Funding Timeline


Fiscal Year	
2020/21	Pandemic Pay for Healthcare, Support Workers (May 2020)
	\$1.6 billion operating funding and \$150 million in capital for healthcare announced for FY 2020/21
	\$1.967 billion for FY 2020/21 reported in Public Accounts
2021/22	\$2.044 billion projected for FY 2021/22 in Q3 Forecast (final results in Public Accounts July 2022)
2022/23	\$875 million announced in Budget 2022 for COVID-19 healthcare response in 2022/23
